5TH NATIONAL HUGE SUCESS

HAPPENINGS OF THE WEEK

All were superb! If only a fraction of what was presented can be remembered and put into use, URDC dancers will be standouts everywhere.

Perhaps here it should be noted that the Gosses conducted their very first clinic and both were heard speaking of advance cases of butterflies. Had they not spoken of those little winged creatures or pointed out the fact that it was their first clinic, no one would have been the wiser. It was an excellent presentation. CONGRATULATIONS!




